

FEDERAL CENSUS OF 1800
Bobbitt family of North Carolina

The second census of the United States government was taken in the year of 1800. George Washington died in 1799. John Adams was president at the time the census was taken. Thomas Jefferson was inaugurated in 1801. The second census counted 5,308,000 white persons as the total population in 1800.

The 1800 census records of North Carolina are among the few that have been preserved. The records of Kentucky and Virginia were accidentally destroyed.

The entire 1800 census records for North Carolina have been searched for members of the Bobbitt family. After many years of research most of the families can be identified. All are considered to be the descendants of William Bobbitt who came from Wales and was granted land in Charles City County, Virginia in 1673.

William Bobbitt was a son of John Richard and Amy (Alston) Bobbitt. He married Susanna James on May 15, 1784 in Warren County. William was a plantation manager and moved frequently during the early years of his marriage. In 1810 he was living in Chester County South Carolina. William and Susanna Bobbitt reared a large family. William died in 1839 in Chester County South Carolina. William was a Revolutionary War Soldier.

Sheerwood Bobbitt was a son of Drury and Elizabeth (Harris) Bobbitt. Sheerwood was born in 1763 in what is today Warren County. On June 28, 1779, Sheerwood married Sarah Burrows. His uncle Randolph Bobbitt was the bondsman for the marriage. Sheerwood served in the war of the Revolution. He reared a large family and died in Halifax County in 1827.

Turner Bobbitt was a son of William and Martha (Turner) Bobbitt. He was born in 1764. He married Elizabeth Mangum in 1783 in Warren County. Turner and Elizabeth Bobbitt had two sons, John B. Bobbitt born in 1787 and William Turner Bobbitt born in 1790.

William Bobbitt was a son of Lewis and Elizabeth (Moore) Bobbitt. He was born in 1738 in Amelia County Virginia. He married Martha Turner in 1762. William died in Raleigh North Carolina on June 6, 1825 in his 87th year of age.

John Bobbitt was a son of John Richard and Amy (Alston) Bobbitt. He was born in 1749 in what is today Warren County. John married a widow by the name of Sarah (Jones) Williams. They had two sons, Archibald and Claiborn Bobbitt. Archibald died young. John and his family moved to Warren County Kentucky, where John died in 1824. His son Claiborn born in 1774 moved to Jackson County in Alabama after the death of his father.

GRANVILLE COUNTY - formed from Edgecombe County in 1746.

The 1800 census of Granville County did not list any Bobbitt families. The families of Warren County and Franklin County lived near the Granville County border. It is likely that there were no Bobbitt families living in Granville County in 1800 or that they were counted as living in Franklin County.

Sion Bobbitt was a son of William and Martha (Turner) Bobbitt. He was born in 1765. He married Sarah Mangum a daughter of Arthur Mangum of Orange County. Sion lived his life in Orange County.

In the year of 1800 there should have been other Bobbitt families in Orange County. For some reason they were not counted.

WARREN COUNTY - formed in 1779 from Bute County.

Warren County is a separate study of the Bobbitt family in the 1800 census records.

Descendants of William Bobbitt were living in Virginia, Kentucky, and North Carolina in 1800. One family was living in Georgia and perhaps three families in South Carolina. There was no families in Tennessee before 1808. Most of the migration to other states was after the war of 1812.

Warren County is the cradle of the descendants of William Bobbitt from Wales who received his land grant in Charles City County, Virginia in 1673. The larger number of his descendants can trace their families back to ancestors from Warren County in North Carolina.

The land in Warren County on which Bobbitt families reared their children has not always been in Warren County. In 1722 the land was in Bertie County. In 1741 the land was in Edgecombe County. In 1746 Granville County was formed from Edgecombe. In 1764 Bute County was formed from Granville County. In 1779 Bute County was discontinued and Warren County was formed. The county was named after Joseph Warren a soldier of Massachusetts who fell while fighting at Bunker Hill in the Revolutionary War.

Bobbitt families have lived on land in what is today Warren County since 1744. Before 1744 the family lived in Halifax County and Chowan Precinct. Since 1719 until the present day, Bobbitt families have been a part of, and lived in, North Carolina.

The names in the 1800 census of Warren County do not mean much to the casual researcher one hundred and seventy six years later. It is hoped that families with Bobbitt ancestors will be aided by the identification of these families living in Warren County in 1800.

Mary Bobbitt was the widow of Miles Bobbitt. Her maiden name was Powell. Mary and Miles were married in 1761 when Mary was probably only 16 years of age. Mary died in Warren County in 1824. Miles Bobbitt was a son of Lewis and Elizabeth (Moore) Bobbitt. He was born in 1731 in Prince George County, Virginia. Miles died in 1794. The family lived on one hundred and twenty acres of land on the north side of Big Fishing Creek. Their known sons were, John, Jacob, Jubilee, Joshua and William.

Joshua Bobbitt was a son of Miles and Mary (Powell) Bobbitt. He was born in 1765. Joshua married Martha Duke a daughter of Mathew Duke. They had one daughter named Dicey Bobbitt born in 1782. In 1806 Joshua and Martha were legally divorced. Joshua later married Patsy Haithcock.

Randolph Bobbitt was a son of John Richard and Amy (Alston) Bobbitt. He was born in 1755 and died in 1804. Randolph Bobbitt married Elizabeth Harris in 1775. Elizabeth was a daughter of Charles and Rachel Harris. The sons of Randolph Bobbitt were John Richard, Lewis Charles, Richard John, and Frederick Harris Bobbitt. Randolph was a brother to Drury, Stephen, John, Alston, Isham, and William Bobbitt. Randolph was the second of these brothers to be deceased before 1810. Alston preceded Randolph in death. The family was a key family in Warren County history.

Drury Bobbitt Senior was a son of John Richard and Amy (Alston) Bobbitt. Drury was born in 1744 and died in 1826. He lived in Warren County until 1815 at which time he moved to Moore County. Drury married Elizabeth Harris in 1761. The sons of Drury and Elizabeth were Sheerwood, Drury Junior, John, and Thomas. There were several daughters in the family.

Isham was a soldier in the war of the Revolution. After the war Isham and his family moved to South Carolina. He lived in South Carolina from 1789 until 1803. He next moved to Christian County Kentucky. In 1827 Isham and several of his sons moved from Kentucky to Morgan County Illinois. Isham died in Morgan County in 1836.

William Bobbitt was a brother of Isham Bobbitt. His wife was Susanna James, a sister of Elizabeth James. William was born in 1761 in North Carolina. For many years we have been unable to identify this William Bobbitt. In 1810 his family is in Chester County South Carolina. The confusion regarding this census record comes from the fact that William was counted in Anson County North Carolina early in 1800. We believe that he was counted again in Edgefield County late in the summer of 1800. Here is the family with the four youngest children. They were joined by their other children later in the year.

Bobbitt Soldier records

Military records show that members of the Bobbitt family served in every major call made by their country. There are positive records of many Bobbitt men who served in the Revolutionary War. There are many of the right age to serve who dropped from the records and undoubtedly gave their lives for the beginning of a government that their descendants have served through the ages to the present time.

The lists that follow are taken from positive records in the National Archives. The lists are made through the War between the States. Later volumes may list the numerous soldiers of the family who served in the Spanish American War, World War One and World War Two. The Korean and Vietnam conflicts and the numerous military skirmishes all had their Bobbitt soldiers.

Many of the individual chapters list the records and the experiences of some of the Bobbitt men who served their country at various points in the history of our country. Several hundred copies of pension records, military service records, and documented state records were made and arranged in note books for use in the writing of individual chapters. The chapters on Bobbitt men who served in the services would make a volume of considerable size and hopefully a book of their services will be printed one day.

During the War between the States Bobbitt men who served were essentially "Confederate Soldiers". Many of their cousins had moved into territories that were Union and they served with unblemished records according to the needs of the communities they lived in.

We would like to think that all Bobbitt soldiers are remembered and that their service and sacrifices are appreciated. We think that it is important to have at least heard their names no matter what the hand of time has obliterated. Each and every Bobbitt should at least have heard of those Bobbitt soldiers who were recorded as having served in the Revolutionary War that began our government and country.

WAR BETWEEN THE STATES 1860-1864
Bobbitt Family Records

The lists here are compiled from records held in the National Archives in Washington, D. C. Some records are duplicated where a person served in one or more branches at different times. The Bobbitt family is essentially a southern Confederate family and even the 25 or 30 soldiers who served on the Union side, were all born in southern states.

The division of BABBITTS AND BOBBITTS follows NORTH AND SOUTH traditions. Babbitt families were from the North and served in the armies of the Union. Bobbitt families were from the South and for the most part served in the armies of the Confederacy.

Before the war, many Bobbitt families had given up slavery for religious reasons. Many families in order to avoid the war had moved west to Kentucky, Tennessee, Missouri, and Illinois. The war between the States could not be avoided.

Bobbitt Confederate soldiers served from the following states; Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, and Virginia.

Bobbitt Union soldiers served from the following states; Illinois, Indiana, and Ohio.

The compiled military service records consist of cards on which, the U. S. War Department, between 1903 and 1927, abstracted information on officers, noncommissioned officers, and enlisted men, from Union Prison and parole records and from captured and other surviving Confederate records, such as muster rolls, returns, rosters, payrolls, appointment books, and hospital registers. Not all soldiers were recorded, but the lists for the Bobbitt family is astonishing in that 163 different listings are recorded.
