

SECTION VII

James Bobbitt (VI - 2), the son of Lewis and Mary Bobbitt, was born in Warren County, North Carolina, on February 1, 1782, and died on May 11, 1846, at Dyer, Gibson County, Tennessee, and is buried there in the old Bobbitt cemetery (45, 46, 47).

On February 10, 1809, James married Mary Gunn in Warren County North Carolina (45, 48). Mary was born in North Carolina (49) on January 26, 1790, and died at Dyer, Tennessee, on January 26, 1853, her 63rd birthday, and is buried in Bobbitt cemetery (45, 46).

Shortly after their marriage James and Mary Bobbitt moved to Mississippi where their first child, William L. Bobbitt, was born on March 9, 1810 (45). It was not long after the birth of this child that James and family moved back to Warren County, where on August 25, 1818, James was appointed Constable in Warrenton District of Warren County as recorded in the following quoted document:

State of North Carolina)
Warren County)

"Know all men by these presents that we James Bobbitt, Thomas E. Person and Moses Bennitt in the State aforesaid, are held and firmly bound unto John Branch, Esq. Governor of the State aforesaid in the just and full sum of Three Hundred Pounds, current money of the State aforesaid; to be now paid to the said Governor or his successors in office. To which payment, well and Truly to be made and done, we bind ourselves, our heirs, Executors and administrators Jointly and Severally, firmly by these presents. Sealed with our Seals, and dated this 25 day of August Anno Domini 1818. The conditions of the above obligation is such that whereas the above bounden James Bobbitt hath been appointed Constable in Warrenton District in the year 1818, Now of the said James Bobbitt, shall well and faithfully execute the office of constable during his continuance in the said office, agreeable to an act of assembly in that case made and provided; then the above obligation to be void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue."

In 1820 James and Mary (Gunn) Bobbitt moved from Warren County, North Carolina, to Rutherford County in Middle Tennessee (93), and then in 1830 moved farther west to the newly formed Gibson County in West Tennessee. Gibson County was formed in 1823 out of a part of the Western District and lies in the fertile watershed of the Obion and the

Forked Deer rivers. It was in what is now Gibson County that David Crockett built his cabin in 1822 and where he lived during much of his bear hunting days and during the six years he spent in the Congress of the United States. David Crockett left his Gibson County home in 1835 to fight for the independence of Texas and died a hero's death at the Alamo on March 6, 1836 (94). He was a near neighbor of James Bobbitt.

James Bobbitt acquired his first tract of land in Gibson County on November 26, 1830, when he purchased 120 acres from Gideon Harrison for \$350.00 (90). By 1839 James had acquired 675 acres of land as shown by the tax roll of that year. His land holdings increased to 741 $\frac{2}{3}$ acres by the time of his death on May 11, 1846. His will was signed on October 11, 1844, and was probated in the July term of court in 1846. His will is recorded in Gibson County Bond Book C, pages 331 and 332 (62). In his will James leaves 266 $\frac{2}{3}$ acres and one negro boy to his son John; 160 acres and a negro man to his son James and 315 acres, cattle and negroes to his wife Mary. Upon Mary's death her share to go to his son Benjamin F. Bobbitt. To his daughter Martha Jane he left one negro woman, and to his daughters Francis Jane, Dorothy and Susan he left cash.

James Bobbitt was a very successful farmer and over the years he owned and used sixteen slaves in his farming operations and for handling the numerous household chores. The slaves were all very devoted to "Massa" James and "Miss" Mary. The names of all slaves were carefully recorded in the James Bobbitt family bible (45) along with their birthdays, as follows:

The little community of farm homes that grew up about the Bobbitt farming operations was first known as Bobbittville (63), but with the coming of the Mobile and Ohio Railroad in 1858 the community was designated Dyer Station as will be more fully discussed in Section XI.

The town of Dyer was originally laid-off on the lands of B.F. Bobbitt, a son of James Bobbitt. In 1899 the town was incorporated as Dyer, Tennessee.

Ten children, all reared as devout Presbyterians, were born to James and Mary (Gunn) Bobbitt (45, 89), as follows:

An account of three of the above children is contained in subsequent Sections as indicated; the other children are discussed (45, 46, 59, 62) in paragraphs that follow:

William L. Bobbitt (VII - 1), was born in Mississippi on March 9, 1810, during his parent's brief sojourn in that state. William married Harriet M. Fay on May 9, 1833. He died on January 25, 1837, and is buried in Old City Cemetery at Nashville, Tennessee.

Dorothy Bobbitt (VII - 2), was born in Warren County, North Carolina, on December 24, 1811. She married Major William J. Davidson who was a native of Gibson County, Tennessee, on August 30, 1838. A child, Ann E. Davidson, was born to that union. Dorothy (Bobbitt) Davidson died on November 10, 1850, at Dyer, Tennessee, and is buried in Bobbitt cemetery (45, 46).

Henry Bobbitt (VII - 3), was born on December 24, 1813, in Warren County, North Carolina. Henry became a Cumberland Presbyterian minister and lived for many years at Henry Station, Henry County, Tennessee. He was also a merchant and was involved in agriculture and other business activities at Henry Station and as a result accumulated a considerable estate. Henry married Jane Dinwiddie on September 13, 1838, at McKinzie, Tennessee. Jane was born in 1822 and died on September 27, 1903. There were no children to that union. Henry Bobbitt died on February 19, 1891, at Henry Station. Both Henry and Jane were brought to Dyer for burial in Bobbitt cemetery. Henry Bobbitt's will is recorded in Henry County in Will Book 1, page 179.

Susan Bobbitt (VII - 4), was born on February 23, 1817, in Warren County, North Carolina, and died at Dyer, Tennessee, on July 20, 1892. Susan married Henry M.L. Barton on September 16, 1838, in Gibson County, Tennessee. Both husband and wife are buried in Bobbitt cemetery at Dyer.

Frances Mary Bobbitt (VII - 5), was born on June 18, 1818, in Warren County, North Carolina. Frances married John H. Dinwiddie in Gibson County, Tennessee, on July 1, 1840.

Miles Bobbitt (VII - 8), was born on June 3, 1826, and died at age ten years on September 24, 1836, at Dyer. He was the first person to be buried in Bobbitt Cemetery, often called Pleasant Grove cemetery.

Martha Jane Bobbitt (VII - 10), the tenth and last child of James and Mary (Gunn) Bobbitt, was born on August 12, 1832, at Dyer, Tennessee, and died at Dyer on April 6, 1857. Martha Jane married Quincy M. Greer on August 31, 1848. A daughter Dolly was a child of that union. One account names the husband of Martha Jane as J.M. Greer (57).

SECTION VIII

Miles Bobbitt (VI - 3), the son of Lewis and Mary Bobbitt was born in Warren County, North Carolina, in 1792 (52). Miles signed his will on February 23, 1859, and his will was probated in Warren County in August 1861 (54).

Miles Bobbitt was married twice; his first marriage was to Susan Gunn in Warren County on October 14, 1814 (48). After the death of his first wife Miles married Martha Davis on January 1, 1827 (48). Martha was born in North Carolina in 1785 and was the daughter of Giles Davis and Elizabeth (Powell) Davis and the granddaughter of Peter and Amy Davis.

Miles was a prominent planter of Warren County and by 1850 had acquired land holdings with an assessed valuation of \$2,241.00, and it is a matter of record that in 1830 the family used twenty three slaves for the farm and household duties.

Miles Bobbitt was blessed with three sons and two daughters. When one reconciles the age brackets in which these children fall, as shown in the 1830 census, with the dates on which Miles entered into his two marriages, it is clear that all five children were the issue of his first marriage. These children of Miles and Susan Gunn Bobbitt are named in Miles' will(54), as follows:

Alpheus Bobbitt (VIII - 1), the above named son of Miles and Susan (Gunn) Bobbitt, was born in Warren County, North Carolina, in 1818 (52). Alpheus followed in the footsteps of his father and became a planter and made his home in the Sandy Creek District of Warren County. Alpheus married Julia Ann Sledge (52, 53) ca. 1841. Julia was born in North Carolina in 1824 (52), the daughter of John Sledge.

Eight children were born to Alpheus and Julia Bobbitt (52, 53) as follows:

William Henry, born 1842, married Winnie Fleming Miles, born October 13, 1843. See further discussion below.

Susan G., born 1846, married a Mr. Welch.

Martha E., called Pattie, born 1849, married a Mr. Johnson.

Ed, became a minister of the gospel.

Peter

Julia Ann, married a Mr. Davis.

Lucy, married Jack Winston

The last four children named above were born after August 2, 1850, the date of the census in the Sandy Creek District.

The author is indebted to Mr. William Edgar Bobbitt of Alexandria, Virginia, a great-grandson of Alpheus Bobbitt, for furnishing the data on which the balance of this Section VIII is based.

Miles Bobbitt, the second child named above, was born October 13, 1843, near Warrenton in Warren County, North Carolina, and died January 27, 1919, at his farm home near Fishing Creek in Nash County, North Carolina, some seventeen miles west of Rocky Mount.

Miles was married to Mary Christian Sledge in Warrenton on November 28, 1867, by the Rev. G.M. Duke. Mary was born on August 13, 1844, and died on January 27, 1929. Both Miles and Mary are buried in a family cemetery on the Miles Bobbitt farm near Fishing Creek. This farm, however, is no longer in family hands.

Mary was the daughter of William Powell Sledge (1812 - 1873) and Martha (Rosser) Sledge.

When the Civil War began Miles Bobbitt enlisted in the Confederate Army and served in Co. E, 1st N.C. Cavalry Regiment, Barringer's^{er} Brigade. He was captured by the Union forces and was in a northern prisoner of war camp when the war ended. It is said that upon his release he walked back to his home in North Carolina, threw his gun and sword in Fishing Creek, and never afterward talked about the war.

Ten children were born to Miles Bobbitt and his wife Mary (Sledge) Bobbitt, as follows:

Clara Morton Bobbitt, born Sept. 23, 1868, died March 17, 1944, married T.E. Powell on January 27, 1891.

Maud Linwood Bobbitt, born February 3, 1870, died Aug. 28, 1922, married John Alford on April 8, 1894.

William Cyrons Bobbitt, born June 2, 1872, died Aug. 24, 1872.

Eugene Carlos Bobbitt, born July 6, 1873, died June 24, 1948. Married twice: 1st to Mrs. Cora Glasgow on Feb. 5, 1896, and 2nd to Mrs. Lucie Elliott Morgan.

Edgar Miles Bobbitt, born Feb. 23, 1876, died April 5, 1879.

James Oswald Bobbitt, born May 10, 1877, died June 28, 1949 married Anne T. Boushall on September 21, 1904.

Joseph Rosser Bobbitt. See further discussion below.

Garland Ashland Bobbitt, born July 17, 1881, died March 20, 1882.

Martha Ann Raymond Bobbitt, born May 21, 1883, died Oct. 3, 1884.

Mary Miles Bobbitt, called Aunt Mamie, born May 15, 1885, died March 21, 1951. Married Ernest Linwood Harris on Jan. 3, 1907.

Joseph Rosser Bobbitt as named above, the son of Miles and Mary (Sledge) Bobbitt, was born on August 1, 1879, on the farm near Fishing Creek in Nash County, North Carolina, and died on December 11, 1961, in Rocky Mount, North Carolina. On June 7, 1905, Joseph Rosser Bobbitt married Julia Elizabeth Daniels (spelled both Daniel and Daniels) in Williamston, North Carolina, at the home of the bride. Julia was born on August 30, 1883, and died on January 1, 1944. Joseph and his wife are both buried in Pineview cemetery in Rocky Mount, North Carolina.

Julia Elizabeth Daniels was the daughter of William Edgar Daniels who was born in 1857, and Sarah Amanda (Short) Daniels who was born in 1862, and the granddaughter of William Barcill Daniels and Julia (Wilson) Daniels.

Joseph Rosser Bobbitt's early schooling was in an old fashioned one room public school in Nash County; later he attended Littleton High School and then the Massy Business College in Richmond, Virginia. Joseph organized and operated several grocery firms. Joseph Rosser Bobbitt was a deeply religious person. At an early age he joined the Fishing Creek Baptist Church and then in 1901 he moved to the First Baptist Church in Rocky Mount in which he held numerous positions of trust and was a Deacon for over twenty five years.

Six children were born to Joseph Rosser Bobbitt and his wife Julia (Daniels) Bobbitt, as follows:

Each of the above five sons and their descendants are further discussed in the following paragraphs.

Joseph Rosser Bobbitt, Jr. was born in Rocky Mount, North Carolina, on November 27, 1906. He is a 1928 graduate of the University of North Carolina. He married Patricia Hope Gilkeson of Bluefield, West Virginia, on October 7, 1939, in Orange, Virginia. Patricia was born October 19, 1912, and died March 21, 1967. Joseph's career has been devoted to newspaper work and makes his home in Norfolk, Virginia. Three children were born to Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Rosser Bobbitt, Jr. as follows:

Joseph Rosser Bobbitt, III, was born September 24, 1940, in Norfolk, Virginia. On December 16, 1967, he married Kathleen Gertrude Morrisette in Norfolk where Kathleen was born on September 22, 1942. A daughter, Myra Hope Bobbitt, was born to that union on August 22, 1968, at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland. Joseph Rosser Bobbitt, III, is a Captain in the United States Army.

William Eskridge Gilkerson Bobbitt was the second child of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Rosser Bobbitt, Jr. and was born on January 2, 1943, in Norfolk. He was a Lieutenant in the United States Army and was killed in action in Vietnam on February 22, 1968.

Elizabeth Burwell Bobbitt is the third child of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Rosser Bobbitt, Jr., and was born on April 29, 1945, in Norfolk. On July 17, 1965, she married Robert deJarnette Ruffin, Jr. who was born January 2, 1941, in Norfolk. One son, Robert deJarnette Ruffin, III, was born in Norfolk, Virginia, on December 4, 1965.

William Edgar Bobbitt, the second son of Joseph Rosser Bobbitt and Julia (Daniels) Bobbitt, was born April 25, 1908, in Rocky Mount, North Carolina. On February 7, 1942, he married Emily Whitehead Taylor Derickson who was born on October 20, 1920, in Norfolk, Virginia. The marriage ceremony was conducted by the Rev. Taylor Willis, D.D. in Christ and St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Norfolk.

William Edgar Bobbitt was a 1930 graduate of the University of North Carolina, with a Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering. Mr. Bobbitt later did graduate work in history at the Norfolk Division of William and Mary College and also took graduate work in International Affairs at Columbia University, along with his then other fellow Naval Officers, in preparation for occupation duty in the far east.

On October 1, 1930, four months after graduation from the University, Mr. Bobbitt was made Civil Engineer in the Ways and Means Department of the street railway division in Norfolk. He later accepted positions in the Electric Departments in Richmond and Fredericksburg, Virginia, and at Williamson, North Carolina. In June 1941, Mr. Bobbitt joined the Navy as Lieutenant (jg) in the Civil Engineer Corps and served until the fall of 1947. Upon his return to civilian life he was made Manager of the Rocky Mount Chamber of Commerce and then in 1950 became Business Manager and Treasurer of the Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Virginia, a position he has held to the present time (1970). The Episcopal High School was founded in 1839 as a boy's boarding school and is unique in its field.

Two children were born to Mr. and Mrs. William Edgar Bobbitt, as follows:

William Edgar Bobbitt, Jr. was born on February 17, 1943, in Norfolk, Virginia. On August 12, 1967, he married Mary Alice Weissmann of Moline, Illinois, in the First Congregational Church of Moline. William Edgar Bobbitt, Jr. is now (1970) a third year law student at Washington and Lee University at Lexington, Virginia.

Emily Calvert Bobbitt is the second child of Mr. and Mrs. William Edgar Bobbitt, and was born on April 14, 1949, in Rocky Mount, North Carolina. Emily is now (1970) a sophomore at Roanoke College in Salem, Virginia.

James Miles Short Bobbitt, the third son of Joseph Rosser Bobbitt and Julia (Daniels) Bobbitt, was born in Rocky Mount, North Carolina, on February 3, 1911. He was married in the First Presbyterian Church in Rocky Mount to Anita Daughtride of Edgecomb Co., North Carolina, on June 4, 1947. Anita was born on September 24, 1920, in Rocky Mount.

James Miles Short Bobbitt attended the University of North Carolina. From 1931 until 1947 he was with the Peoples Bank and Trust Co. of Rocky Mount, except for three years between 1942 and 1945 when he served as Sergeant in the United States Army, much of that service in England. In 1947 Mr. Bobbitt opened his own business, a sports and hobby shop, in Rocky Mount. Mr. Bobbitt sold his business in 1967 and retired. Mr. and Mrs. James Miles Short Bobbitt have no children.

Julian Daniel Bobbitt, the fourth son of Joseph Rosser Bobbitt and Julia (Daniels) Bobbitt, was born on March 14, 1914, in Rocky Mount, North Carolina. He was married to Mary Wood Winslow of Rocky Mount on June 25, 1949, in the Church of the Good Shepherd by the Rev. Gray Temple. Mr. Bobbitt is a 1936 graduate of the University of North Carolina. During his entire working life he has been in the advertising and sales work, except for four years when he was a line officer in the Navy. During World War II he served as a Lieutenant (jg), much of the time aboard an oiler, the U.S. Maumee, with sea duty in both both the Pacific and Atlantic oceans.

Mr. and Mrs. Julian Daniel Bobbitt have two children, as follows:

Mary Wood Bobbitt, born July 15, 1950, in Rocky Mount. Mary is now (1970) a freshman at St. Mary's College in Raleigh, North Carolina.

Julian Daniel Bobbitt, Jr., born October 2, 1951, in Rocky Mount, North Carolina. Julian is now (1970) a senior at Rocky Mount High School and is Captain of the football team.

Robert Lee Bobbitt, the fifth son of Joseph Rosser Bobbitt and Julia (Daniels) Bobbitt, was born April 28, 1921, in Rocky Mount, North Carolina. He married Mavis Yvonne Morgan in Chicago, Illinois. Miss Morgan was born in London, England.

Robert Lee Bobbitt graduated from the University of North Carolina

in 1942 and the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine in 1945. He interned in the Veteran's Hospital in Fayetteville, North Carolina, and at Bryn Mawr Hospital near Philadelphia. Dr. Bobbitt has practiced surgery in Norfolk, Virginia, at Rocky Mount, North Carolina and at Chicago, Illinois. Dr. Bobbitt now practices in Waukegan, Illinois, where he and Mrs. Bobbitt now make their home.

Two children have been born to Dr. and Mrs. Robert Lee Bobbitt: Robert Lee Bobbitt, Jr. who was born on September 13, 1959, and Elizabeth Ann Bobbitt who was born on April 12, 1961. Both children were born in Chicago, Illinois.

Among the above named five sons of Joseph Rosser Bobbitt, William, Julian and Robert are Episcopalians, James is a Presbyterian and Joseph is a Baptist.

SECTION IX

John William Bobbitt (VII - 6), the son of James and Mary (Gunn) Bobbitt, was born on June 30, 1820 (40, 45), in Rutherford County, Tennessee. It was in 1830 that John moved with his parents from Rutherford County to Gibson County, Tennessee, and it was there that he made his home until his death on May 22, 1893, at Dyer.

John William Bobbitt married Mary Jane Province at Dyer on December 3, 1845 (45). Mary Jane was born in Kentucky on December 1, 1821, and died at Dyer, Tennessee, on February 19, 1889 (40, 45, 46). Both John and Mary are buried in the old Bobbitt cemetery, sometimes called the Pleasant Grove cemetery.

John was a successful planter and a highly respected citizen of Gibson County. He was a very religious man and was one of the founders of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church at Dyer and was elected one of the first ruling elders. Regarding the organization of that church the following is quoted, in part, from an article by Miss Annie Lou Drane of Dyer, that appeared in 1945 in *The Cumberland Bell*, Vol. 3, No. 2, page 3, a publication of the Dyer church.

"We are all familiar with a plot of ground about a mile northeast of town, and now known as Pleasant Grove or Bobbitt cemetery. It is a rather secluded spot several hundred yards from the main road. A few steps inside the gate to this cemetery, then look to your left and almost at your feet you will notice a little mound. This mound was once a dirt and stick chimney at the north end of a little log house which looked out toward the south through the shadows of a thickly wooded grove. Its windows were holes cut from the logs, and they were provided with shutters that kept out the light as well as the rain and snow. Inside were seats made of slabs of logs; and you warmed by a big open fireplace which burned logs -- all cut from the storehouse of nature which surrounded it."

"This was the birthplace of the Dyer Cumberland Presbyterian Church which was the first church in Dyer. It was on a Saturday afternoon, May 20, 1848. ... What a glorious time for such an event. Is it any wonder that it was called "Pleasant Grove Society"? This band of fifty one earnest men and women, casting aside the toils and cares of home, the fear and anxieties of a great civil strife then brewing and gathered amid the beauties of nature to erect an altar to Nature's God."

"The records tell us that the Rev. J.W. Needham of Trenton with part of his society were present, and that Rev. Needham preached. Rev. John W. Grier was chosen pastor. The four ruling elders elected are still fresh in the memories of many: Uncle Ephrim Davidson and Uncle John Bobbitt, whose old home stands nearby on the old Rutherford road, Uncle Henry Barton and James Orr."

The following five Bobbitts were present among the fifty one who organized the church on that May 20, 1848: John W. Bobbitt, James Bobbitt, Mary Bobbitt, Eliza Bobbitt and Mary J. Bobbitt.

Nine children (57, 58) were born to John William Bobbitt and Mary Jane (Province) Bobbitt, as follows:
